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## Fragile and Conflict Affected Situations FCS

**Fragility:** 3 key features for development: basic state functions; legitimacy; political processes

- OEDCD-DAC: „**State fragility** is defined as a lack of capacity to perform basic state functions, where “*capacity*” encompasses
- (a) organizational, institutional and financial capacity to carry out basic functions of governing a population and territory
- and (b) the state’s ability to develop mutually constructive and reinforcing relations with society.

## Fragile and Conflict Affected Situations FCS

- **State capacity is achieved through:**
- **political processes of constructive state-society bargaining, which in turn require legitimacy;**
- **capacity and legitimacy can then become mutually reinforcing, and contribute to state building**
- **The dynamic can also be negative if a lack of capacity undermines legitimacy and vice versa, contributing to state fragility.”**
- **Don't forget: *Global drivers of conflict and fragility***

# The New Deal

- Building on Paris Declaration (2005), Accra Agenda for Action (2008), Principles of Good International Engagement in Fragile Situations (2010), the Monrovia Roadmap (2011) and the working groups of the International Dialogue on Peacebuilding and Statebuilding.
- Global trends: Millenium Declaration, Post-MDGs' debate; World Development Report 2011; post-stabilisation paradigm.
- Use 5 Peacebuilding and Statebuilding Goals (PSGs) to guide our work in fragile and conflict-affected states and situations.
- Focus on new ways of engaging and new partnerships to support country led and owned transitions out of fragility.
- Build mutual trust by providing aid and using domestic resources more effectively.

## SDC's Peacebuilding and Statebuilding Strategy: How to work in fragile contexts - Application of CSPM

- **Causes and Effects** -> interests of dividers and connectors
  - **Actors mapping** -> understand the context
  - **Fragility issues** -> relationships in disorder
  - **Fragility needs** -> transition to social and political peace
  - **Fragility trends** -> understand the different scenarios
  - **Relevance assessment** -> contribution to change
  - **Theory of Change** -> assumptions and intervention logic

- **Monitoring of Impact of Program on Context** -> Result Framework
  - **Monitoring of Impact of Context on Programme** -> MERV
  - **Comprehensive risk management** -> making the institution fit for purpose = to stay engaged

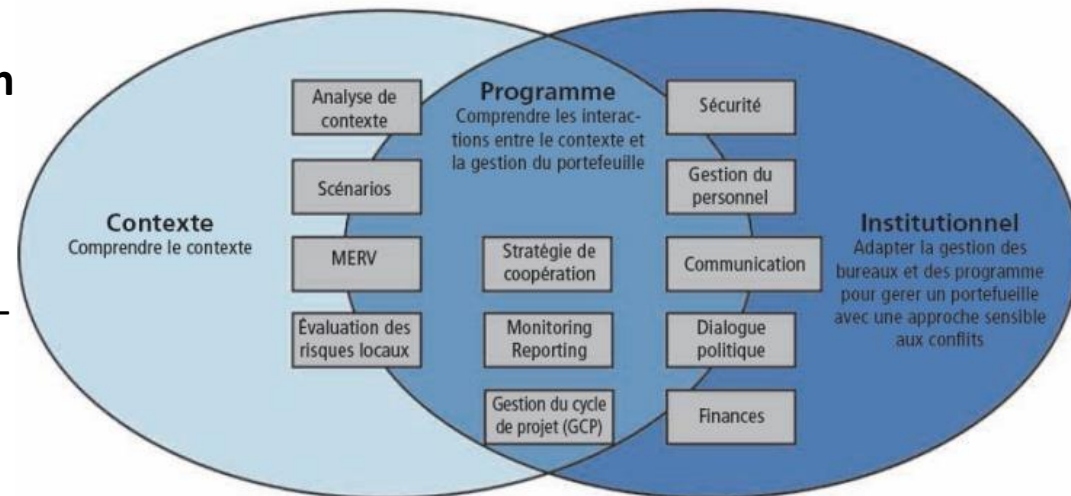
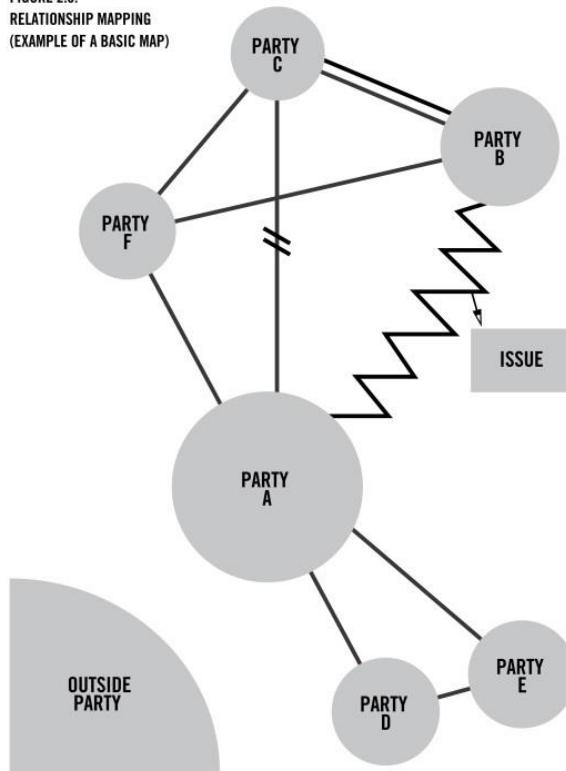
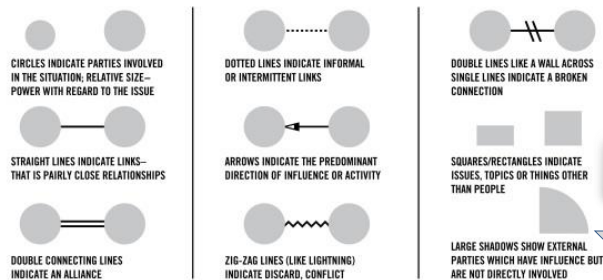


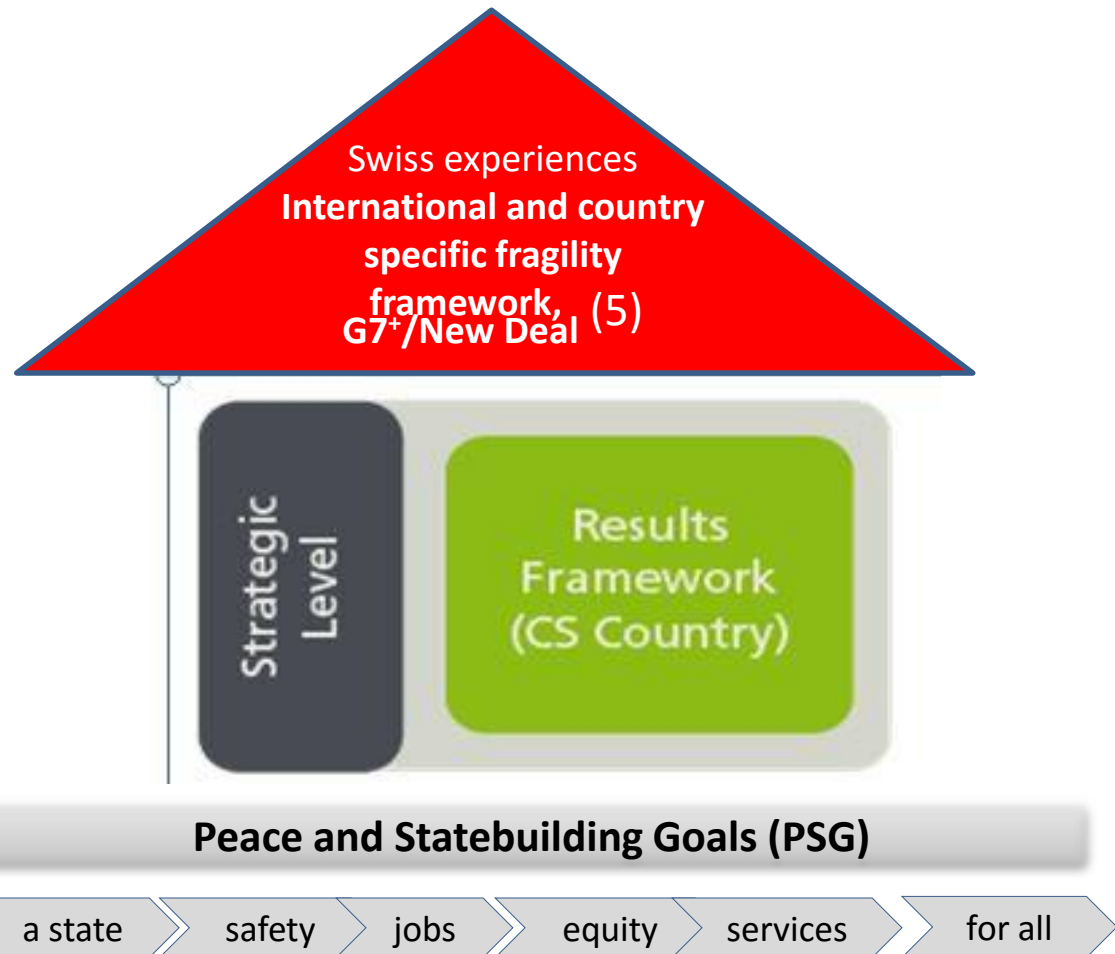
FIGURE 2.3:

(EXAMPLE OF A BASIC MAP)



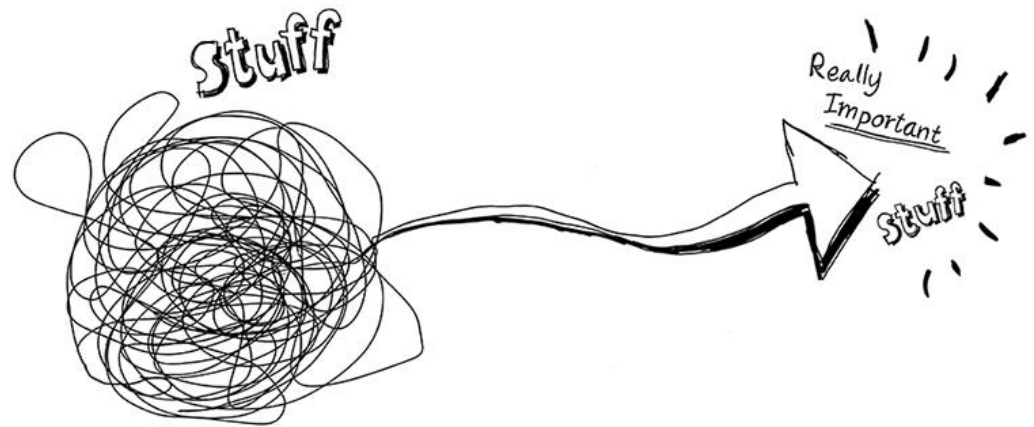
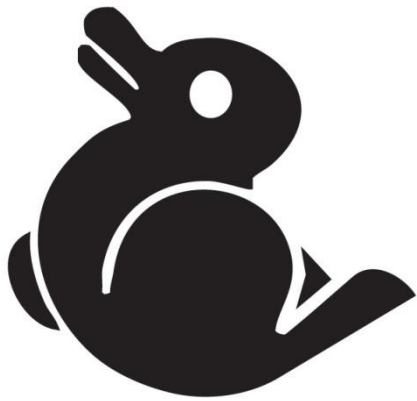
