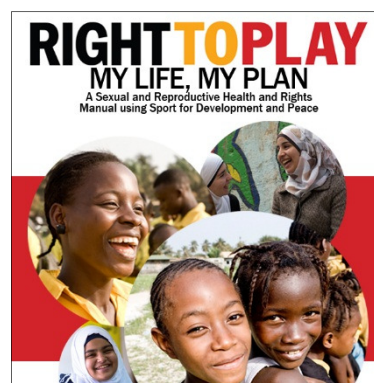
Title: My Life, My Plan: transforming SRH practices and creating supportive environments through play

Abstract:

Right To Play will share its approach in addressing SRHR challenges, using play and sport as a tool to increase knowledge, change attitudes and behaviors of youth and their environment. The presentation will especially lead the audience through Right To Play’s SRHR training resource My Life, My Plan, for teachers and community coaches. A particular focus will be the importance of supporting youth to develop the life skills they need to make positive decisions about their future and access health services. An interactive dialogue will allow participants to exchange experiences on multi-sectoral approaches to SRHR and good practices in influencing communities positively.

Title: Healthy Generation Project - Strategies to assure access to youth friendly health services in the Republic of Moldova

Health for Youth Association will present experience on Scaling up of Youth Friendly Health Services (YFHS) in Moldova in framework of the “Healthy Generation” project, supported by Swiss Cooperation Office, WHO, UNICEF and UNFPA.



During the first phase of project implementation YFHS (2011-2013) were scaled up geographically in all country districts. Moldovan Government ensures sustainability and continuity of the provision of YFHS by funding their activities from compulsory health insurance funds. As a result, during the period the last two years has increased about 3 times access for youth friendly health services - from 5 % in 2011 to 15 % in 2013.

Title: Promoting young women’s rights related to safe motherhood

Name of Presenter: Janet Perkins

Organisation: Enfants du Monde

Abstract: Assuring that women are able to exercise their rights to safe motherhood is critical to the health of all women during pregnancy, birth and following birth; however this is particularly true for pregnant adolescents. These young women face elevated risks when they experience pregnancy and birth and therefore have an increased need to be able to realize their rights.



Enfants du Monde (EdM), in collaboration with local partners, is contributing to promoting women’s rights related to maternal health in Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Colombia, El Salvador and Haiti. In each of these countries, the percentage of women experiencing first pregnancy before the age of 18 is particularly high, at 40%, 28.2%, 19.7%, 24.4% and 15% respectively. EdM’s work in promoting MNH rights is occurring within the context of implementing programmes based on the World Health Organization’s (WHO) framework “Working with Individuals, Families and Communities (IFC) to improve maternal and newborn health (MNH)”.
