

Basel Dialogue

This workshop is one in a series of dialogues spearheaded by the Novartis Foundation on global health issues. The forthcoming dialogue will draw from experience gained in the long commitment and progress in managing infectious disease to be used for the rise of non-communicable diseases (NCDs), in particular, treatment approaches and patient empowerment. The Basel expert dialogue aims at discussing lessons learned as input for future strategies on the emerging dual burden of disease (infectious and non-communicable) in low-middle income countries.

- How will the changing demographics of urbanization and globalization impact the dual disease burden?
